Because emotions can be nouns, adjectives or verbs extra notes are provided.

Need volitional aspect explained

Dative suffix used with intransitive verbs expressing cause of emotion: djarri

3.81 *marrin-tjarri-pu witji-ku*
happy-EMOT-3sg meat-DAT
'He's glad for the meat.'

3.82 *wanki-yi-pula-nji ngapa-ku*
cry-PR-3du-IMM water-DAT
'They two were crying out for water.'

The verb 'to be' or 'become' is yi-

The verb 'to do' or cause to happen is ba-

happy / good	marrinj	also happy person
silent (or quiet)	wirrinj	often used as a command
sad/pathetic sad person	mila-mila milamila-gaamba	
lying a lie	marrgi midjin	also means red to tell a lie (verb) - midjin-bu middyin – to pretend
angry	gurdi	adjective to become angry (verb) – gurdi- <i>djari</i> <i>*-djari or -djarri is a suffix which you add to mean 'it's an emotion'</i>
jealous	gumungilaa	be jealous (verb) – bardigula-
selfish	gurriyida	adjective
greedy	muraagunj	adjective
lazy	yandha	adjective
teasing	yirrinj	note – this word is very close to night (yurrij)
wild / agitated	galgi	adjective
cheeky	njirrinjirri	very commonly used
tired to be tired	gilya gilya ba-	adjective to be tired verb
to feel sick or to feel hurt	maari-	verb
afraid	garra <i>there are 57 references to the word garra in Lynn Oates.</i>	garra has multiple meanings: to be afraid (fear) – verb to throw (or to spill) – verb sting (verb) – garra-garra across – verb suffix meaning many -garra suffix meaning number - garra
one who is lonely /sad or to be lonely	nuba	note: this is a verb, unlike nuba meaning wife – which is a noun
one who is alone	gamala	oneself
to feel	gurda-	verb physically, to touch unsure if it also means emotionally?
